It is a valuable monitoring tool for parents. It will send a reminder of homework due to the parents as well as student

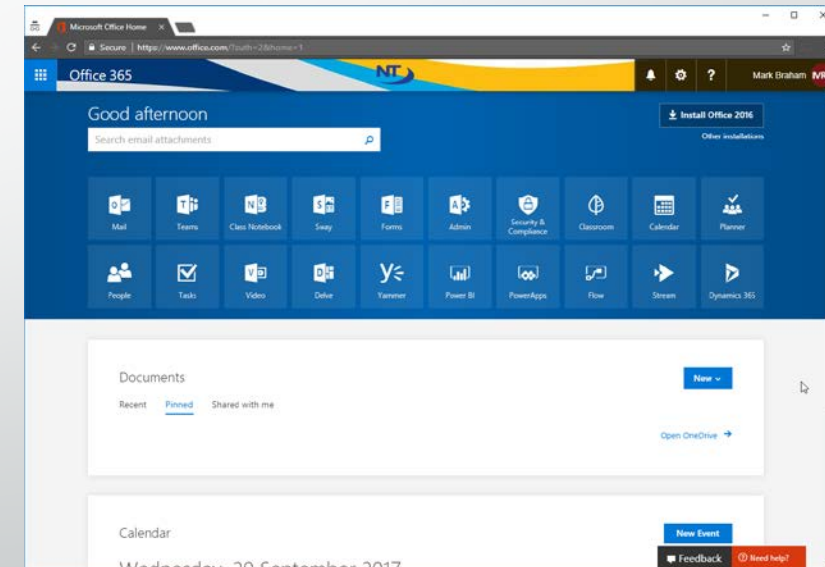
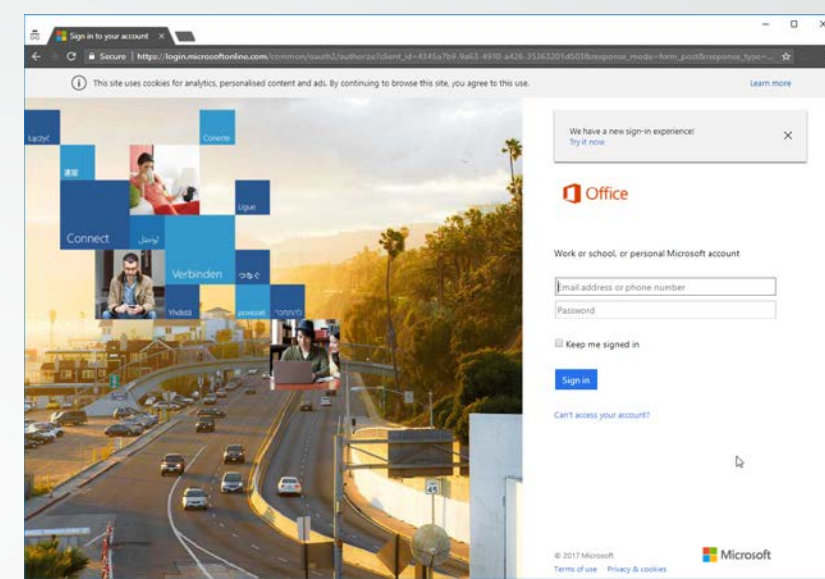
OFFICE 365 ONLINE SAFETY

How to access Office 365

- Visit <http://office.tretherras.net>
- Login with school email address and normal network password
e.g. MarkSmith17@students.tretherras.net
- Once logged in, chose whether to download / install Office at home, or view the web versions of any Microsoft application in the cloud
- Each user has up to 1TB of free cloud storage – easy to use in school, work can then be accessed and worked on at home on any device!

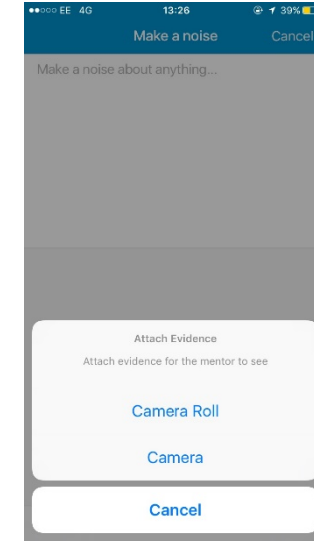
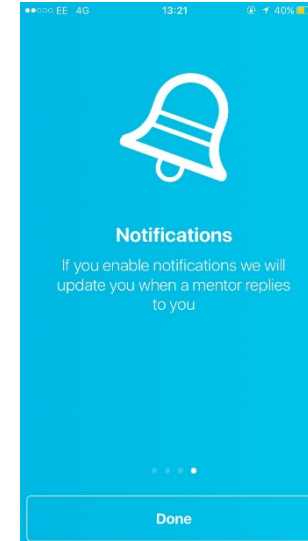
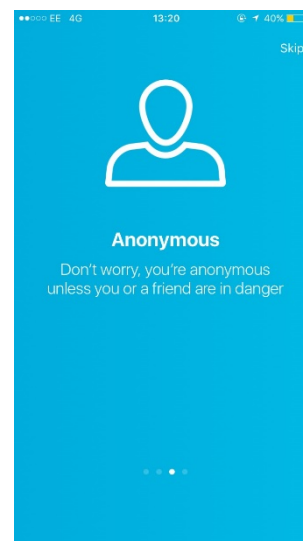
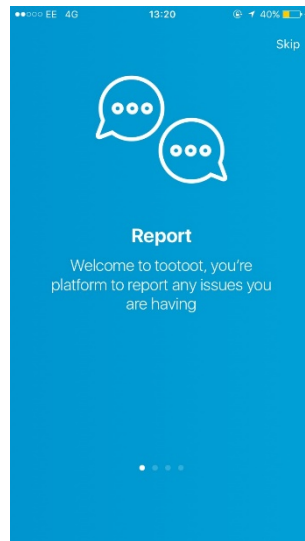
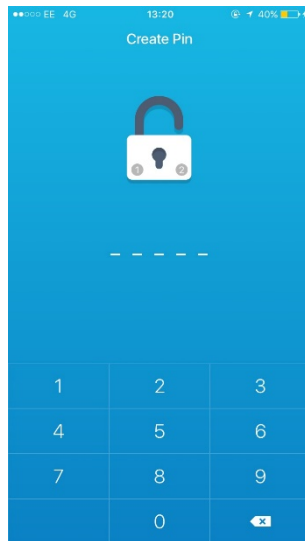
Key objectives of the programme

- Provide pupils, with the ability to report any bullying and cyberbullying, or any other worries they may have to school and get support and advice on how to deal with the issue
- Provide schools with an automated process to ensure all reported incidents of bullying and cyberbullying can be dealt with, using an agreed escalation process, following existing policies and procedures.
- Provide a bullying and cyberbullying resource hub to support schools, young people and parents to deal with the worries and concerns of cyberbullying. I.e. reporting issues directly to social media platforms.
- Generate evidence, via tootoot's school reporting dashboard and through an external evaluation, to show that the programme provides a successful approach in ensuring that children and young people feel able to report issues.



Students

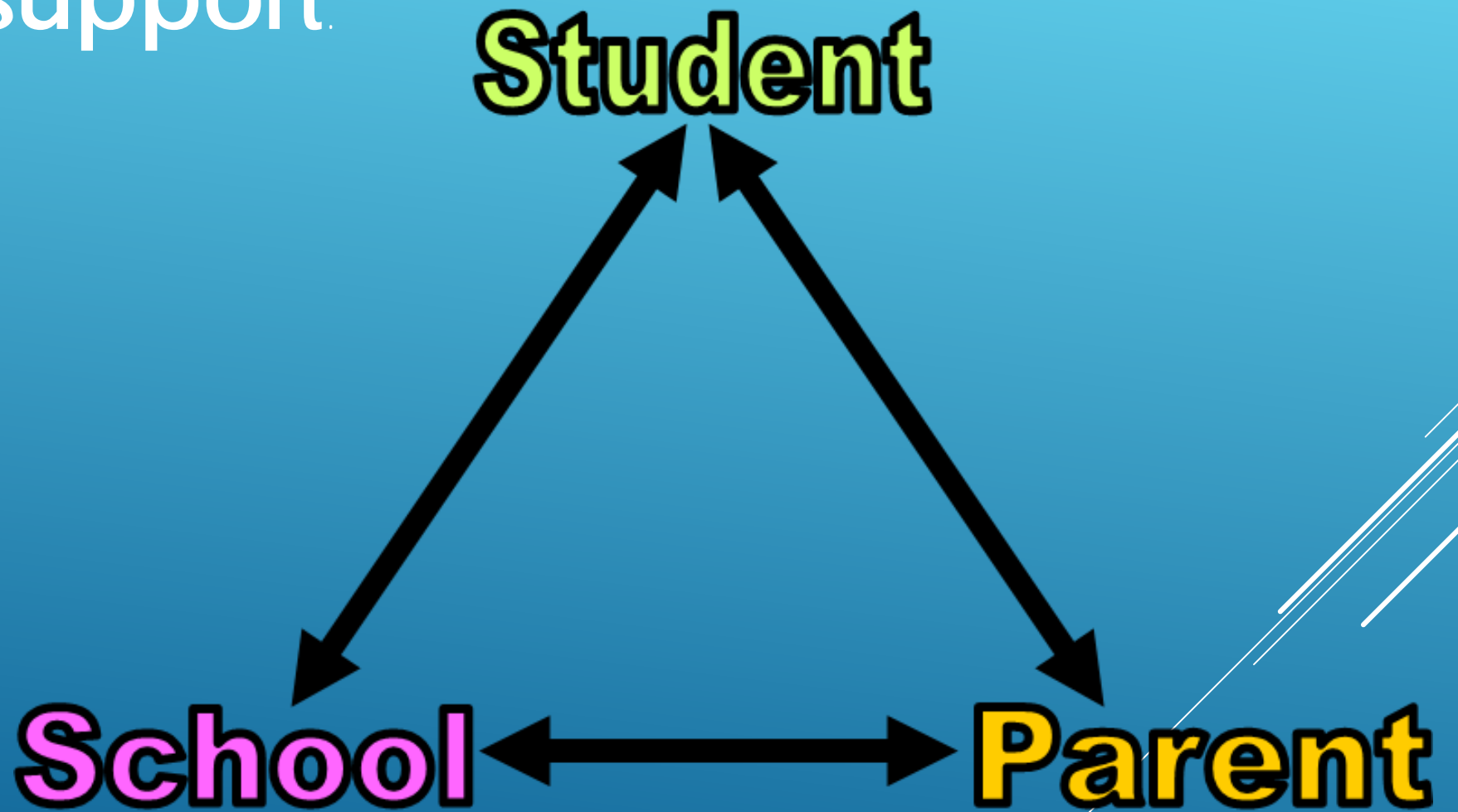
Students can report on any device directly to the school
